


# MYSTERY QUILT 2017 Designed by Ann Johnson for Connecting Threads

## Part 2



Fabric 1: C 32 squares 3 7/8"

Fabric 2: D 8 squares 6 1/2"

Fabric 3: J 32 squares 3 1/2"

K 8 squares 7 1/4"

### FLYING GEESE

There are several ways to make flying geese. Feel free to use a different one.


1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side all C's.




The blue is supposed to the wrong side of the fabric but my EQ skills are not

sufficient to make it look like that. Applies to all these steps.

2. Lay 2 C's in opposite corners of a K, right sides together. Note the direction of the diagonal lines. Sew a scant 1/4 seam on both sides of the diagonal line and cut on the line. Press C's away from K.




3. You now have two separate pieces



that look like this.

4. Lay a C in the corner of the K, right sides together. Note the direction of the diagonal line. Sew a scant 1/4 from both sides of the diagonal line and cut on the line.



- 5 Each K square will result in four flying geese. They should measure 3 1/2" X 6 1/2".

Make 32



SAWTOOTH STARS

1. Sew a J on each side of a flying goose. Press seams toward J's.  
Measurement should be 3 1/2" X 12 1/2". Make 16.




2. Sew a flying goose to each side of a D side. Press seams toward D's.  
Measurement should be 6 1/2" X 12 1/2". Make 8.
