

# MYSTERY QUILT 2017

## Part 3

To avoid confusion label your fabric, I made a sheet of paper with a small corner of the fabric on it and label them 1, 2, 3, 4.



Cutting Instructions: wof means width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge

Fabric 3: L six 4 ½" X 8 ½"

Fabric 4: P fourteen 4 ½" X 8 ½"

Q three 18 ¼" squares cut twice diagonally

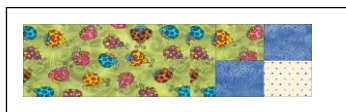
R two 9 ⅜" squares cut once diagonally

1. Sew a P strip to a 4 patch unit from part 1 step 5. Pay attention to the direction of the four patch units. The colours need to be exactly as shown.



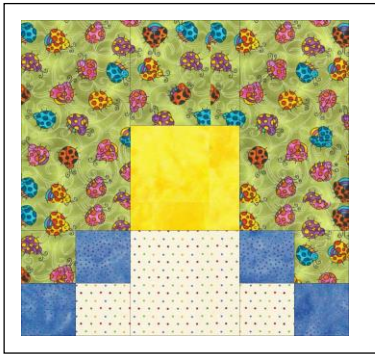
Make 10 units. Press seams toward P  
size is 4.5" X 12.5"

2. Sew a P strip to a four patch unit from part 1 step 5. Again pay attention to the direction of the four patch.



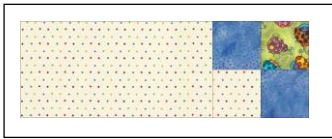
Make 4 units. Press seams toward P.  
Size is 4.5" X 12.5"

3. Sew a unit from step 1 to a unit from part 1 step 6 as shown. Sew a unit from step 2 to the other side.



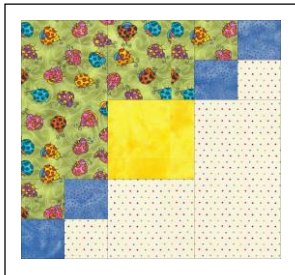
Make 4. Size is 12.5" X 12.5"

4. Sew an L to a four patch unit from part 1 step 5. Again pay attention to the direction of the four patch.



Make 6. Press seam toward L.  
Size is 4.5" X 12.5"

5. Sew a unit from step 1 to a three patch unit from part one step 6. Sew a unit from step 4 to the other side.



Make 6.  
Size is 12.5" X 12.5"

6. Sew the blocks into rows (rows go diagonally) with Q setting triangles on each end as shown. See picture below. Press seams in each row in alternate directions for nesting or press open for flatter seams with sawtooth star points. Sew the rows together. Press. HINT it works well to sew the top in two halves and join in the middle. Add the R in each corner.
