Block 1 - Block of the Month Club 2021

THE OHIO STAR BLOCK

Materials:

1 light fabric

I medium or dark fabric
Thread
Ruler
Cutter, etc

Enlarge the pattern if you chose, or you can do paper piecing if you like. I chose to enlarge the pattern and use it as a guide. I laid my completed block over the pattern to ensure it was the correct size. Or just cut your pieces and sew together. Use the same fabrics through out the blocks or use scraps. We will be adding coordinating fabrics to future blocks.


Blocks should be 12.5 x 12.5 and 12 x 12 finished.


As per diagrams of pattern:

- cut 4 light blocks 4 1/2 x 4 1/2 in. square for the corner pieces
- cut 1 medium or dark 4 1/2 x 4 1/2 in. Square for the center of the block
- $\,$ cut 1 pieces of light fabric 5 1/4 square and 1 of the dark fabric (see attached sheet on how to make the quick hourglass units)


Press seams toward the darker fabric.

When you have the pieces cut and the hourglass pieces sew together, lay out as follows and sew together in rows, then join the rows together.

How to Make a Quilt

Quick Hourglass Units

Try our quick and easy method to make hourglass units without cutting triangles. The Fons & Porter Quarter Inch Seam Marker helps you draw stitching lines quickly.

- From 1 light and 1 dark fabric, cut 1 square 1½" larger than the desired finished size of the hourglass unit.
- 2. On wrong side of light square, place Quarter Inch Seam Marker diagonally across square, with yellow center line positioned exactly at corners. Mark stitching guidelines along both sides of Quarter Inch Seam Marker (Photo A).
 NOTE: If you are not using the Fons & Porter Quarter Inch Seam Marker, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner across square. Then draw sewing lines on each side of the first line, ¼* away.
- Place light square on dark square, right sides facing; stitch along marked sewing lines.
- Cut between rows of stitching to make 2 triangle-squares (Photo B). Press seams toward darker fabric.





- square, place Quarter Inch
 Seam Marker diagonally across
 square, perpendicular to seam,
 aligning yellow center line
 with corners of square. Mark
 stitching guidelines along both
 sides of Quarter Inch Seam
 Marker (Photo C). See note in
 #2 if you are not using the Fons
 & Porter Quarter Inch Seam
 Marker.
- 6. Place triangle-square with drawn line on matching triangle-square, right sides and opposite fabrics facing. Stitch along both drawn lines. Cut between rows of stitching to create 2 hourglass units (Photo D). Press seam allowances to 1 side.
